INTRODUCTION

- * Knowing God The Quest ... And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. (John 17: 3)
- * We have considered The Existence and Exclusiveness of God, The Composition of God, The Attributes of God (Natural, Vocational, & Moral)
- * As we have examined the Moral Attributes of God ... we have seen a constant theme running through the Scriptures the glorification through His redemption of man. This remption process is culminated in the Goodness of God.
- * We have seen that God is holy and righteous but we are not. Yet God is loving and faithful and desires for all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth ... and that truth is that God, in His goodness, made a way for us to be reconciled to Him through the payment of the penalty of our sins. That "way" was for God Himself to be incarnate, taking on the form of a servant in the likeness of man and dieing on the cross AND THEN raising from the dead conquering death!

* Mercy: compassionate or kindly forbearance shown toward an offender, an enemy, or other person in one's power Biblically: when I do not get what I deserve
