Now consider this ... there are over 300 prophecies concerning "The Life of Christ" - His birth, life, death, burial and resurrection

To help conceptualize the remoteness of the probability that one man could fulfill the prophecies fulfilled in Jesus Christ, Dr. Peter Stoner (1888-1980), Chairman of the Departments of Mathematics and Astronomy at Pasadena City College (1913-1953), and Chairman of the Science Division of Westmont College from 1953 to 1957, calculated the probability that a person would fulfill just 8 of the over 300 prophecies which were fulfilled in the life of Jesus Christ. In 1944, he published his research results in Science Speaks: Scientific Proof of the Accuracy of Prophecy and the Bible.

The eight prophecies that he and his statististics class used were:

1) Micah 5:2 ... Bethlehem (1 in 280,000 born in Bethlehem ... 2.8x10⁵)

2) Malachi 3:1 ... preceded by a messenger (conservative estimate at 1 in $1,000 \dots 1x10^3$)

3) Zechariah 9:9 ... King will enter riding on a donkey (conservative estimate at 1 in $100 \dots 1x10^2$)

4) Zechariah 13:6 ... betrayed by Judas (conservative estimate at 1 in 1,000 ... 1x10³)

5) Zechariah 11:12 ... 30 pieces of silver (conservative estimate at 1 in 1,000 ... $1x10^3$)

6) Zechariah 11:13 ... Judas would try to return the silver (1 in $100,000 \dots 1x10^5$)

7) Isaiah 53:7 ... making no defense for Himself (1 in 10,000 ... $1x10^4$)

8) Psalm 22:16 ... pierced hands and feet (1 in 10,000 ... 1x10⁴)

Factoring in the number of people who have lived at 88 billion, Stoner and his class concluded that the probability of one person fulfilling just eight of the specific prophecies was one chance in 10^{17} (one followed by 17 zeros). How about one person fulfilling just 48 of the over 300 prophecies? Stoner calculated these odds at one chance in 10^{157} !

To illustrate how largeness the number 10¹⁷, Stoner gave this illustration: suppose that we take 10¹⁷ silver dollars and lay them on the face of Texas. They'll cover all of the state two feet deep. Now mark one of these silver dollars and stir the whole mass thoroughly, all over the state. Blindfold a man and tell him that he can travel as far as he wishes, but he must pick up one silver dollar and say that this is the right one. What chance would he have of getting the right one? Just the same chance that the prophets would've had of writing these eight prophecies and having them all come true in any one man, from their day to the present time, providing they wrote them in their own wisdom.
