- \* The reign of David the man after God's own heart.
- \* Over the past couple of weeks we have considered the everlasting covenant that YHWH's made with David and David's initial response to God's faithful loving-kindness being extended to him. David sought to expand the kingdom according to God's prophecy to Abraham and then sought to show the faithful loving-kindness of God to Mephibosheth (Jonathan's son) and Hanun (the son of the King of Ammon).
- \* However, last week we considered David's struggle with temptation. In that study, we saw God's statement of consequences to David and considered the "ripple effect" of sin (how the consequences of our sin negatively influences the lives of others around us as well).
- \* Today, we consider we will consider another of those ripple effects.
