INTRODUCTION

- * The book of 1 Samuel is a transitional book. It begins in the time of the Judges and leads us into the reign of David.
- * The three primary characters of this book are: Samuel, Saul and David.
- * As the book of Judges was summarized by two key passages (2:8,10 and 21:25), so the remainder of Israel's history can be prefaced with Israel's statement recorded in 8:19-20 "No, but we will have a king over us, that we also may be like all the nations"
- * Last week, we began looking at the transition from the period of the judges to the period of the kings ... with the rejection of YHWH as the king of Israel.
- * Today, we begin to see that God was going to give Israel exactly what they wanted ... in the Anointing of Saul as the 1st king of Israel.
- * Saul: He was the son of Kish; He was the most likely choice ... He was "goodly;" pleasant
