- * The transition from Saul to David now having been completed, we have seen David's consolidation of the kingdom under his reign in recent weeks culminating with the arrival of the ark in Jerusalem that we studied last week.
- Two key learnings from last week's failed and then successful attempt to bring the ark to Jerusalem: (1) Our good intentions are not enough when it comes to how we honor God and His Word. God expects more than casual, convenient obedience. And then (2) We should not give up when we fall short and things do not turn out like we hoped or planned. We need to get back in God's Word, seek His forgiveness for any errors and then move forward in faith, trusting Him for a different outcome next time.
- This morning we will look at 1 Chronicles 16 as David models for us a key principle of the Christian life, namely taking time for thanksgiving. With the ark safely in Jerusalem it was time for celebration, thanksgiving and praise. And David's Psalm in this chapter reveals a number of key aspects that we should regularly incorporate into our own times of thanksgiving.
