TEXT: Matthew 7:13-23 INTRODUCTION

- * "Focusing on the Messiah in the book of Matthew" ... Matthew was a Jewish man writing about the Jewish Messiah to a Jewish audience.
- * The Message of John and Jesus was the same: "Repent (metanoia change the way you think) for the kingdom of the Heavens has drawn near!"
- * Jesus is conveying the Standard of the Kingdom; a standard which is different and higher than that of the world, and which is definitive in nature: you cannot serve the world and God at the same time!
- * Last week, we transitioned into the final phase of this teaching in the 'Sermon on the Mount' in which Jesus reveals that the Kingdom Standard is a Practical Standard. The application of this different, higher, definitive standard should bring discernment to those who follow it.
- * Discernment is the ability to judge well. It is the art of thinking critically without being unnecessarily critical.
- * Jesus discusses our need for discernment in three areas: Our Insights (Opinions), Our Path, and Our Foundation. Today, we consider Our Path.
