Proverbs 17:14 The beginning of **strife** (madon - a contest; quarrel) is like releasing water; therefore stop **contention** (riyb - personal or legal **contest; controversy; cause**) before a **quarrel** (gala-to be obstinate) starts.

- John 13:34-35³⁴ A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵ By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."
- John 17:15-21¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth. ²⁰ "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; ²¹ that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.
- 1 Corinthians 11:18-19¹⁸ For first of all, when you come together as a church, I hear that there are divisions among you, and in part I believe it. ¹⁹ For there must also be factions among you, that those who are approved may be recognized among you.

Proverbs 17:1 Better is a dry morsel with quietness, than a house full of feasting with strife (riyb).

WHO WOULD DO SUCH A THING? (The Instigator)

A F_____ Person

Proverbs 18:6-7⁶ <u>A fool's lips</u> enter into contention (riyb), and his mouth calls for blows. ⁷ <u>A fool's mouth</u> is his destruction, and his lips are the snare of his soul.

A P Person

Proverbs 18:1 A man who isolates himself seeks his own desire; He rages (gala) against all wise judgment.

Proverbs 28:25 He who is of a proud heart stirs up strife (madon), but he who trusts in the LORD will be prospered.

- Proverbs 13:10 By pride comes nothing but strife (matsah), but with the well-advised is wisdom.
- Proverbs 21:23-24²³ Whoever guards his mouth and tongue keeps his soul from troubles. ²⁴ <u>A proud (ziyd) and haughty man</u>--"Scoffer" is his name; he acts with arrogant (zadon) pride (ebrah). (*prideful rage/wrath*)

Proverbs 22:10 Cast out the scoffer, and contention (madon) will leave; Yes, strife and reproach will cease.

A W Person

- Proverbs 6:12-15¹² <u>A worthless person (belial)</u>, a wicked man, walks with a perverse mouth; ¹³ he winks with his eyes, he shuffles his feet, he points with his fingers; ¹⁴ perversity is in his heart, he devises evil continually, he sows **discord** (madon). ¹⁵ Therefore his calamity shall come suddenly; suddenly he shall be broken without remedy.
- Proverbs 16:27-28 ²⁷ <u>An ungodly man (belial)</u> digs up evil, and it is on his lips like a burning fire. ²⁸ <u>A perverse man</u> sows **strife** (madon), and <u>a</u> whisperer (nirgan) separates the best of friends.
- Proverbs 26:20-22 ²⁰ Where there is no wood, the fire goes out; and where there is no <u>talebearer (nirgan)</u>, **strife** (madon) ceases. ²¹ As charcoal is to burning coals, and wood to fire, so is a **contentious** (midyan) man to kindle **strife** (riyb). ²² <u>The words of a talebearer (nirgan)</u> are like tasty trifles, and they go down into the inmost body.

ΑW

Proverbs 15:18 <u>A wrathful (khemah-hot/heat) man</u> stirs up **strife** (madon), but he who is **slow to anger (aph - nose; "flaring of nostrils")** allays **contention (riyb)**.

Proverbs 29:22 An angry man (aph) stirs up strife (madon), and a furious man abounds in transgression.

A H Person

Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirs up strife (m-dan), but love covers all sins.

Proverbs 15:17 Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a fatted calf with hatred.

Matthew 5:9 Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

Proverbs 17:14 The beginning of **strife** (madon - a contest; quarrel) is like releasing water; therefore stop **contention** (riyb - personal or legal **contest; controversy; cause**) before a **quarrel** (gala-to be obstinate) starts.

Proverbs 20:3 It is honorable for a man to stop striving (riyb), since any fool can start a quarrel (gala).

Proverbs 26:17 He who passes by and meddles in a quarrel (riyb) not his own is like one who takes a dog by the ears.

Proverbs 14:29 He who is **slow to wrath** (aph) has great understanding, but he who is impulsive (lit. short-spirited) exalts folly.

Proverbs 15:1 A soft answer turns away **wrath** (khemah-hot/heat), but a harsh word stirs up **anger** (aph).

Proverbs 16:32 He who is **slow to anger** (aph) is better than the mighty, and he who rules (mashal) his spirit (ruakh) than he who takes a city. Proverbs 19:11 The discretion of a man makes him **slow to anger** (aph), and his glory is to overlook a transgression.

Proverbs 25:9-10 ⁹ Debate (riyb) your case (riyb) with your neighbor, and do not disclose the secret to another; ¹⁰ Lest he who hears it expose your shame, and your reputation be ruined.

Proverbs 30:33 For as the churning of milk produces butter, and wringing the nose produces blood, so the forcing of wrath (aph) produces strife (riyb).

Proverbs 18:18 Casting lots causes **contentions** (midyan) to cease, and keeps the mighty apart.
