- * In our study of the book of Proverbs, we have been considering some Pearls of Wisdom.
- * Last week we began considering the volume of verses regarding "The Righteous.".
- * Today, Lord willing, we will investigate what is declared regarding the impact that the righteous will have in their family and community, and then the inheritance that is promised them.

- * Read Psalm 119:7, 62, 106, 137-138, 142, 144, 160, 164, 172. What should be our view of, and reaction to, the judgments and commandments of God?

- Genesis 15:5-6⁵ Then He brought him outside and said, "Look now toward heaven, and count the stars if you are able to number them." And He said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And **he believed in the LORD, and He accounted it to him for righteousness** (tsadaqah).
- Deuteronomy 6:24-25 ²⁴ And the LORD commanded us to observe all these statutes, to fear the LORD our God, for our good always, that He might preserve us alive, as it is this day. ²⁵ Then **it will be righteousness** (tsadaqah) **for us, if we are careful to observe all these commandments** before the LORD our God, as He has commanded us.'
- Romans 3:19-4:25
 - ¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty (ὑποδικος) before God. ²⁰ Therefore by the deeds of the law no flesh will be justified (δικαιοω) in His sight, for by the law is the knowledge of sin. ²¹ But now the righteousness (δικαιοσυνη) of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, ²² even the righteousness (δικαιοσυνη) of God, through faith (πιστις) in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe (πιστευω). For there is no difference; ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ being justified (δικαιοω) freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith (πιστις), to demonstrate His righteousness (δικαιοσυνη), because in His forbearance God had passed over the sins that were previously committed, ²⁶ to demonstrate at the present time His righteousness (δικαιοσυνη), that He might be just (δικαιος) and the justifier (δικαιοω) of the one who has faith (πιστις) in Jesus. ²⁷ Where is boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith (πιστις). ²⁸ Therefore we conclude that a man is justified (δικαιοω) by faith (πιστις) apart from the deeds of the law. ²⁹ Or is He the God of the Jews only? Is He not also the God of the Gentiles? Yes, of the Gentiles also, ³⁰ since there is one God who will justify (δικαιοω) the circumcised by faith (πιστις)? Certainly not! On the contrary, we establish the law.
 - **4**¹ What then shall we say that Abraham our father has found according to the flesh? ² For if Abraham was justified (δικαιοω) by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³ For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed (πιστευω) God, and it was accounted (λογιζομαι) to him for righteousness (δικαισσυνη)." ⁴ Now to him who works, the wages are not **counted** ($\lambda oy(\zeta o \mu \alpha)$) as grace but as debt. ⁵ But to him who does not work but believes ($\pi i \sigma \tau \epsilon u \omega$) on Him who justifies ($\delta_{1}\kappa_{1}\omega_{2}\omega_{3}$) the ungodly, his faith ($\pi_{1}\sigma_{1}\sigma_{3}$) is accounted ($\lambda_{2}\sigma_{1}\omega_{3}$) for righteousness ($\delta_{1}\kappa_{1}\omega_{2}\omega_{3}$), ⁶ just as David also describes the blessedness of the man to whom God imputes ($\lambda o \gamma (\zeta o \mu \alpha)$) righteousness ($\delta (\kappa \alpha (o \sigma \nu \eta))$) apart from works: ⁷ "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered: ⁸ blessed is the man to whom the LORD shall not **impute** (λογιζομαι) sin." ⁹ Does this blessedness then come upon the circumcised only, or upon the uncircumcised also? For we say that faith ($\pi_1\sigma_1\varsigma_1$) was accounted ($\lambda_0\sigma_1\zeta_0\mu_0$) to Abraham for righteousness (δικαιοσυνη). ¹⁰ How then was it accounted (λ ογιζομαι)? While he was circumcised, or uncircumcised? Not while circumcised, but while uncircumcised, ¹¹ And he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the **righteousness** ($\delta_{1}\kappa\alpha_{1}$) of the faith ($\pi_{1}\sigma_{1}\sigma_{1}$) which he had while still uncircumcised, that he might be the father of all those who believe ($\pi_1\sigma_{\tau_{\nu}}$), though they are uncircumcised, that righteousness (δ_{ν}) might be imputed ($\lambda_{\sigma\nu}$) to them also, ¹² and the father of circumcision to those who not only are of the circumcision, but who also walk in the steps of the faith ($\pi_{13}\sigma_{13}$) which our father Abraham had while still uncircumcised. ¹³ For the promise that he would be the heir of the world was not to Abraham or to his seed through the law, but through the righteousness (δικαιοσυνη) of faith ($\pi_{10}\sigma_{15}$).¹⁴ For if those who are of the law are heirs, faith ($\pi_{10}\sigma_{15}$) is made void and the promise made of no effect, ¹⁵ because the law brings about wrath; for where there is no law there is no transgression. ¹⁶ Therefore it is of **faith** $(\pi_{1}\sigma_{1})$ that it might be according to grace, so that the promise might be sure to all the seed, not only to those who are of the law, but also to those who are of the faith ($\pi_1 \sigma \tau_1 \varsigma$) of Abraham, who is the father of us all ¹⁷ (as it is written, "I have made you a father of many nations") in the presence of Him whom he **believed** ($\pi_1\sigma\tau\epsilon_{UG}$)--God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did; ¹⁸ who, contrary to hope $(\epsilon \lambda \pi_{15})$, in hope $(\epsilon \lambda \pi_{15})$ believed (πιστευω), so that he became the father of many nations, according to what was spoken, "So shall your descendants be."¹⁹ And not being weak in faith ($\pi_{10}\sigma_{15}$), he did not consider his own body, already dead (since he was about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰ He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief $(\alpha \pi i \sigma \tau i \alpha)$, but was strengthened in faith $(\pi i \sigma \tau i \varsigma)$, giving glory to God, ²¹ and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform. ²² And therefore "It was accounted ($\lambda o_{\gamma} (\zeta o_{\mu} \alpha)$) to him for righteousness (δικαιοσυνη)." ²³ Now it was not written for his sake alone that it was **imputed** (λ ογιζομαι) to him, ²⁴ but also for us. It shall be **imputed** ($\lambda oy(\zeta oya)$) to us who **believe** ($\pi i \sigma \tau e \omega$) in Him who raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead.²⁵ who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification ($\delta_{i}\kappa\alpha_{i}\omega\sigma_{i}\varsigma_{j}$).
- 2 Corinthians 5:18-21 ¹⁸ Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, ¹⁹ that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not **imputing** (λογιζομαι) their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. ²⁰ Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. ²¹ For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the **righteousness** (δικαιοσυνη) of God in Him.

THE INCLINATIONS OF THE RIGHTEOUS

HIS TEACHABLENESS

Proverbs 9:9 Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a just (righteous) man, and he will increase in learning.

HIS TENDERNESS

Proverbs 12:10 A righteous man regards the life of his animal, but the tender mercies of the wicked are cruel.

HIS THOUGHTS

Proverbs 12:5 The thoughts of the righteous are right, but the counsels of the wicked are deceitful.

HIS TONGUE

Proverbs 10:6 Blessings are on the head of the righteous, but violence covers the mouth of the wicked.

Proverbs 10:11 The mouth of the righteous is a well of life, but violence covers the mouth of the wicked.

Proverbs 10:20 The tongue of the righteous is choice silver; the heart of the wicked is worth little.

Proverbs 10:21 The lips of the righteous feed many, but fools die for lack of wisdom.

Proverbs 10:31 The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but the perverse tongue will be cut out.

Proverbs 10:32 The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable, but the mouth of the wicked what is perverse.

Proverbs 11:30 The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and he who wins souls is wise.

Proverbs 12:12 The wicked covet the catch of evil men, but the root of the righteous yields fruit.

Proverbs 15:28 The heart of the righteous studies how to answer, but the mouth of the wicked pours forth evil.

THE IMPACT OF THE RIGHTEOUS

In Their Home

... The House of the Righteous

Proverbs 3:33 The curse of the LORD is on the house of the wicked, but He blesses the home of the just *(of the righteous)*.
Proverbs 12:7 The wicked are overthrown and are no more, but the house of the righteous will stand.
Proverbs 14:19 The evil will bow before the good, and the wicked at the gates of the righteous.
Proverbs 15:6 In the house of the righteous there is much treasure, but in the revenue of the wicked is trouble.

Proverbs 23:24 The father of the righteous will greatly rejoice, and he who begets a wise child will delight in him.

... The Memory of the Righteous

Proverbs 10:7 The memory of the righteous is blessed, but the name of the wicked will rot.

Proverbs 20:7 The righteous man walks in his integrity; His children are blessed after him.

Proverbs 13:22 A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children, but the wealth of the sinner is stored up for the righteous.

In Their Community

Proverbs 11:10 When it goes well with the righteous, the city rejoices; and when the wicked perish, there is jubilation.

Proverbs 28:12 When the righteous rejoice, there is great glory; but when the wicked arise, men hide themselves.

Proverbs 28:28 When the wicked arise, men hide themselves; but when they perish, the righteous increase.

Proverbs 29:2 When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice; but when a wicked man rules, the people groan.

Proverbs 10:16 The labor of the righteous leads to life, the wages of the wicked to sin.

Proverbs 21:15 It is a joy for the just (the righteous) to do justice, but destruction will come to the workers of iniquity.

Proverbs 29:7 The righteous considers the cause of the poor, but the wicked does not understand such knowledge.

Proverbs 21:25-26²⁵ The desire of the lazy man kills him, for his hands refuse to labor. ²⁶ He covets greedily all day long, but the righteous gives and does not spare.

Proverbs 29:16 When the wicked are multiplied, transgression increases; but the righteous will see their fall.

Proverbs 29:27 An unjust man is an abomination to the righteous, and he who is upright in the way is an abomination to the wicked.

Proverbs 17:15 He who justifies (*tsadaq - to be right*) the wicked, and he who condemns the just, both of them alike are an abomination to the LORD.

Proverbs 17:26 Also, to punish the righteous is not good, nor to strike princes for their uprightness.

Proverbs 18:5 It is not good to show partiality to the wicked, or to overthrow the righteous in judgment.

Proverbs 24:24 He who says to the wicked, "You are righteous," him the people will curse; nations will abhor him.

THE INHERITANCE OF THE RIGHTEOUS

His Position

Proverbs 15:29 The LORD is far from the wicked, but He hears the prayer of the righteous.

His Foundation

Proverbs 10:3 The LORD will not allow the righteous soul to famish, but He casts away the desire of the wicked.

Proverbs 10:24 The fear of **the wicked** will come upon him, and the desire **of the righteous** will be granted. Proverbs 10:25 When the whirlwind passes by, **the wicked** is no more, but **the righteous** has **an everlasting foundation**.

Proverbs 10:30 The righteous will never be removed, but the wicked will not inhabit the earth.

Proverbs 11:8 The righteous is delivered from trouble, and it comes to the wicked instead.

Proverbs 11:9 The hypocrite with his mouth destroys his neighbor, but through knowledge the righteous will be delivered.

Proverbs 11:21 Though they join forces, the wicked will not go unpunished; but the posterity of the righteous will be delivered.

Proverbs 11:28 He who trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like foliage.

Proverbs 12:3 A man is not established by wickedness, but the root of the righteous cannot be moved.

Proverbs 12:13 The wicked is ensnared by the transgression of his lips, but the righteous will come through trouble.

Proverbs 12:21 No grave trouble will overtake the righteous, but the wicked shall be filled with evil.

Proverbs 14:32 The wicked is banished in his wickedness, but the righteous has a refuge in his death.

Proverbs 18:10 The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are safe.

Proverbs 24:15 Do not lie in wait, O wicked man, against the dwelling of the righteous; do not plunder his resting place; Proverbs 24:16 For a righteous man may fall seven times and rise again, but the wicked shall fall by calamity.

Proverbs 28:1 The wicked flee when no one pursues, but the righteous are bold as a lion.

Proverbs 29:6 By transgression an evil man is snared, but the righteous sings and rejoices.

His Expectation

Proverbs 10:28 The hope of the righteous will be gladness, but the expectation of the wicked will perish.

Proverbs 11:23 The desire of the righteous is only good, but the expectation of the wicked is wrath.

Proverbs 11:31 If the righteous will be recompensed on the earth, how much more the ungodly and the sinner.

Proverbs 13:5 A righteous man hates lying, but a wicked man is loathsome and comes to shame.

Proverbs 13:9 The light of the righteous rejoices, but the lamp of the wicked will be put out.

Proverbs 13:21 Evil pursues sinners, but to the righteous, good shall be repaid.

Proverbs 13:25 The righteous eats to the satisfying of his soul, but the stomach of the wicked shall be in want.

Proverbs 21:12 The righteous God wisely considers the house of the wicked, overthrowing the wicked for their wickedness.

THE INJUCTION TO THE RIGHTEOUS

Proverbs 2:20 So you may walk in the way of goodness, and keep to the paths of righteousness (of the righteous).

Proverbs 4:14-19¹⁴ Do not enter the path of **the wicked**, and do not walk in the way of evil. ¹⁵ Avoid it, do not travel on it; turn away from it and pass on. ¹⁶ For they do not sleep unless they have done evil; and their sleep is taken away unless they make someone fall. ¹⁷ For they eat the bread of wickedness, and drink the wine of violence. ¹⁸ But the path **of the just** *(of the righteous)* is like the shining sun, that shines ever brighter unto the perfect day. ¹⁹ The way of **the wicked** is like darkness; they do not know what makes them stumble.

Proverbs 12:26 The righteous should choose his friends carefully, for the way of the wicked leads them astray.
