INTRODUCTION

- * Last week, we began studying the book of Daniel and briefly considered three key elements that will be reflected throughout this book: The Impact of Daniel's God, The Impact of Daniel's Life, and The Impact of Daniel's Writing.
- * In chapter 1, we immediately saw the impact of Daniel's life ... as he was taken by the Chaldeans, from his home in Jerusalem, to Babylon in order to serve Nebuchadnezzar (along with three other Jewish young men). In the midst of the international turmoil and personal afflictions, Daniel purposed in his heart not to defile himself before his God. His decision had an effect upon the other three Jewish young men as well. Daniel's life began to make an impact in the lives of those around because of his commitment to YHWH.
- * Today, we learn a bit more of this committed life and the impact that God will make, using Daniel, in the life and government of the most powerful man on earth Nebuchadnezzar. We will take two weeks to consider this event, today looking at the Practical Application of Daniel's Faith, and, Lord willing, next week considering the Prophetical Interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar's Dream.
