INTRODUCTION

- * In recent weeks we have been considering the transition from Saul to David.
- * Last week we looked at the events and the effects surrounding Saul's death which ended with David's lamentation for Saul and Jonathan.
- * In considering that the true cause of Saul's death was unfaithfulness, we were reminded that our unfaithfulness can have unintended consequences such as demoralizing those who look to us for spiritual leadership. And in the process, our enemy, the devil, rejoices over our failures.
- * Today, we will pick up the storyline perhaps expecting David to quickly step into his God-ordained role as King of Israel.
- * But before that will happen, we will once again see how unfaithfulness to God's plans, this time through Abner, Saul's general, leads to some very unpleasant consequences including a tragic end to Abner's life.
- * And we will see a contrast between David's willingness to patiently stay on God's trail and Abner's desire to cut his own selfish and prideful path.
