

## INTRODUCTION

- \* In the beginning of this series, I stated that I believed that the Theme of the Book was: "The Presentation of 'A New and Living Way' through the Perfect Propitiation of Jesus who eternally fulfilled the requirements of the Yom Kippur Sacrifices!"
- \* Last week, we began to consider the apex of the book, the declaration of this theme. The author of the book has been building to this point using various Jewish themes to reveal the deity of the Messiah, His role at bringing the ultimate "rest" which was not given through Moses or Joshua. It was the Messiah's role to come and establish the New Covenant declared by Jeremiah by offering Himself as the Ultimate Propitiatory Sacrifice for sins.
- \* To fully understand what the consummation of eternal redemption would look like to the Jewish people, we need to understand the complexity of the sacrificial system and the progressive nature of redemptive covenants. This Redemptive Plan was something that God initiated before He formed the foundations of the world!
- \* Today, Lord willing, we will consider the Progression of the Redemptive Plan (as revealed through the Sacrificial System, the Covenants, and Scripture) and the Presentation of the Ultimate Sacrifice.

### I. THE PROGRESSION OF THE REDEMPTIVE PLAN

#### A. Revealed through the Sacrificial System

1. QORBAN (H7133; cf. Leviticus 1: 2,3,10; used 82x in 78v; 40x in Leviticus; 38 in Numbers) - A general offering
2. MINKHAH (H4503; cf. Genesis 4:3-5; Genesis 32:13,18,20,21; Leviticus 2:1-15; used 211x in 194v) - a present; a fellowship offering
3. OLAH (H5930; cf. Genesis 8:20; 22:2-13; Leviticus 1:3,4,6,9,10,13,14,17; used 288x in 262v; 148x in Pentateuch; 20x in Ezek) - burnt offerings; that which is irrevocably given over to destruction
4. ISHSHAH (H801; cf. Exodus 29:18,25,41; Leviticus 1:9 65x in 64v) - something offered up by fire
5. SHELEM (H8002; cf. Exodus 20:24; 24:5; Leviticus 3:1,3,6,9 ... 87x in 84v; 49x in Lev/Num) - a thank offering of peace
6. TERUMAH (H8641; cf. Exodus 29:27-28; 30:13-15; Leviticus 10:14-15; used 76x in 63v) - a heave offering; a present/offering
7. TENUPHAH (H8573; cf. Exodus 29:24,26,27; 35:22; Leviticus 7:30 ... 30x in 28v) ... a "wave" offering; something waved before God
8. KHATTA'AH (H2403; cf. Leviticus 4; 294x in 270v) - sin/offense; the offering/sacrifice/expiation/punishment for the sin
9. ASHAM (H817; Leviticus 5:6,7,15,16,18,19; 1 Samuel 6:3,4,8,17) guilt; trespass; an offering for fault; atonement for guilt
10. ZABAKH (H2077; cf. Gen 31:54; 46:1; Exod 12:27; 18:12; 162x in 153v) - the slaughtering an animal for a sacrifice or fellowship
